Moon Rocks to be on Display at Lake Villa District Library

By special arrangement with NASA's Johnson Space Center, lunar rock and meteorite samples will be on display at Lake Villa District Library over four days in early August.

The lunar rock display samples are comprised of six authentic Astromaterials collected by Apollo astronauts and are contained in a 6-inch, clear Lucite disk. The Lunar Disk contains three lunar rock samples and three lunar soil samples. The Meteorite Disk contains six different types of meteorite samples collected from different impact sites around the world.

Before the library could be eligible to borrow the samples, a staff member had to attend a NASA Certification Workshop. Elisa Gueffier, LVDL's Head of Youth Services, jumped at the chance. "This fit our summer reading program theme of 'curiosity' perfectly," said Gueffier. "When I learned of the workshop, I registered right away."

The library has scheduled four sessions for people to come and view the rocks: Saturday, August 4 from 2:30-4:30pm; Monday, August 6 from 9:30-11:30am; Tuesday, August 7 from 11:30am-1:30pm; Thursday, August 8 from 5:30-7:30pm. No registration is necessary.
